Dear members, friends, and family of Lutheran Memorial:

Deep Thoughts......"Light in the Darkness!" One of my favorite parts of this season is the decorations and the lights—let me be even clearer—AFTER THE DECORATING IS DONE! I loathe the idea of having to get out all the totes and separate things into different sections, different tasks for differing members of the family, the dusting and vacuuming that goes with it, the checking of batteries and cleaning out the crusted acidic buildup in the decorations where we forgot to remove batteries from Christmas's past. But.....to sit back in the recliner after everything is said-and -done, and to look around the house experiencing this different ambiance in the room, just changes my spirit! The lighting is different—the sound of the candled wooden fuses crackling—the twinkle in my daughters' eyes—the whole mood becomes different. THAT IS......until I stepped outside!

The first night I went outside last week, after having staked the inflatables into the ground and routed the mass of wires into their proper places and allowing the multiple (yes, I said "Multiple") fan motors breathe life into these jolliest of Christmas pieces on this side of the North Pole----I discovered on that first night, that over half of the internal lights had burned out. Not only did some of them burn out, but Rudolph's blinking, red nose, which is in fact, supposed to be inside his nose, had somehow become detached, internally, and fell down into his belly—"Rudolph the Red-Bellied Reindeer!" (Doesn't sound right...does it!?) Needless to say, my Christmas joy was being overcome by thoughts of disappointment, thoughts of replacement, thoughts of pulling the plug (literally). I thought to myself, "How ridiculous do these things look at night time, half lit, and not even glowing the way they're supposed to?" I'm literally thinking out loud as I write this while I look out my office window, but how truthful could these dilapidated, poorly lit inflatables truly represent how so many of us might be feeling right now? *Inside my house,* Christmas and all of its lights seem ever-so-perfect! Outside in the lawn, however, standing in the darkness—wobbling in the

breeze—15' Santa standing in utter-darkness, while Rudolph's belly flashes red—the 8' tall candy cane in Frosty's hand that NEVER STAYS STANDING UPRIGHT—the darkness seems to overcome the feelings of this season! For some of us, we take so much care to put everything in its perfect place, in hopes that everyone would believe that we are in perfect shape and everyone would be able to sit back and emulate who we are, or who we've become; yet, the truest form of how we really feel—how life around us might actually be taking shape in our personal lives, is most clearly equated by the dilapidated lawn inflatables outside. **EXCEPT**....."The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it!" (John 1:5) The sun rises in the morning, and there, the inflatables stand in their glory! The darkness will not overcome them! They stand there making kids smile as they walk to school! They still wobble to-and-fro, and yes, the candy cane still never seems to stay standing, but such is life! God's light—God's sunshine beams on us and reminds us that in God's Glory—in his dazzling array—we are sanctified by His Grace and we receive light and warmth for a new day! Ironically, the Christmas lights and decorations that we want to believe are perfect on the inside of the house......well...they get shut off when we leave the home and the timer goes 'click'.

Brothers and sisters in Christ—we certainly are not and should not pretend to be perfect during this time of year—or any time of year, no matter the decorations, festivities, or occasions. We are like the inflatables which certainly have their frailties, and have seen better days and seasons, but God's glorious light still shines upon us! Let us be humbled and come before the Lord, even, and especially if it's when we find the darkness of the season and the darkness of our lives closing in. Even though we might have seasons of brokenness and disappointment, God promises to shine His light into our darkness, so that the darkness will not overcome us! Call the Meeting to Order by Vice President Swartos and Prayer by Pastor Craig

Consent Agenda (Action Needed)

- Approve Minutes
- Approve Financial Report
- Current giving pledges are down; hope to see an increase in contributions-some of those came early Motion to approve consent agenda made by Kelly Nelson, 2nd by Todd Bernhard; motion carried.

Discussion Items

- Trustees- Wayne Winter
 - Approved replacement of phone system by email vote; bid was around \$5000 through CommTech
 - o Insurance coverage- 6 companies in the state that are accredited, but none gave us a quote; possibility of looking out of state, but they won't be accredited. One quote from State Farm came in- \$51,000. And additional coverage for workmen's compensation. Doug and Carolyn Hofer have been doing a lot of the leg work on this. He will contact Fisher Rounds also.
 - Kalwal- bid by Spectro and will get on the schedule for spring. It is leaking currently. Insurance check has been received for this repair.
 - o Vacancy in ministry house- a name has been provided for a potential renter
 - Building permit variance application has been submitted and will be reviewed at the Dec. 4 city council meeting.
 - Youth House- Lindsay Rounds had two realtors look at the house- there is still value in the house. After careful conversation the Trustees came up with the following suggestions: 1) sell as is-\$150,000; 2) repair it and rent it (at a cost of about \$80,000 of repairs); 3) tear it down (at a cost of about \$40,000). Trustees would make a recommendation to council to put youth house on the market and give approval to Trustees to hire a realtor to sell it as is and the \$11,000 for roof repairs would be given to the buyer to fix the roof. This would not be done until the variance has been approved by the city council.

Motion to accept recommendation of the trustees to hire a realtor to sell the Youth house, pending approval of building variance made by Bernhard; second by Kim Farries; following discussion, the motion carried.

- Building committee (Phase 1 and Phase 2 teams)- needs to be moving forward-Phase 1 and 2 are complete; what are the next steps; chain of command needs to be established; Trustees have made a recommendation that Council be thinking about putting a Phase 3 team together to hold regular meetings and report back to Council.
- Youth Team- Andrea Clarke
 - We packed 63 boxes for Operation Christmas Child!
 - Our tree is up and decorated at the Capital with our children's ornaments displayed!
 - Wednesday/ Sunday school kids are off to a great start of practicing for their Christmas Program on Sunday,
 Dec. 10th, at 4pm
 - o Confirmation Students will be making holiday cards for our local care facilities. Hope to get some kids to deliver them as well.

- We will have our last Sunday School on Dec 10th and last Wednesday School on Dec 13th before the holiday break.
- Youth Group: Planning their Christmas Party (Sunday Dec 17th, a youth family is hosting)
- o Making YouthWorks trip plans for Summer 2024; hotels fun day tickets etc.
- We have had some successful fundraisers to help alleviate costs for the mission trip. Planning on a couple more meal fundraisers for 2024- dates TBD.

Pastor Craig's Report

- Staff evaluations were completed on Oct. 31st.
- Mark Undeberg will come a couple days a week and clean; we have had one application go out, but has yet to be returned. Marcie reached out to Service Master- has not heard anything. Pastor Craig reached out to someone also for a quote but has not received the quote yet.
- An anonymous donor and spouse would like to completely remodel upstairs bathrooms; will hold off until we
 know more on the building project.
- o Churchwide/Synod- Bishop Eaton is on leave of absence for 4-6 months; Bishop from SE Iowa is filling in; working on creating new constitutional rewrites which will impact all churches down the road
- Christmas Eve worship (Sunday) 3:30, 6, 10;
- o Has performed more baptisms this year than ever before
- 8 funerals in 3 ½ weeks' time

- Has made good progress; still have a few openings to take care of; resolution to amend the bylaws passes, then we still have one opening on council to fill; 3 vacancies on trustees- 4 people interested in serving; Audit committee has 2 members- waiting to hear on one spot.

Changes to agenda: moved Lindsay's report on Youth House appraisals to beginning of agenda as she needed to leave early. Add Audit Committee.

Youth House Appraisal:

- Realtors felt there was still value in the house.
- 3 options: 1) Sell as is include insurance money to buyer; 2) sell to someone known to LMC through contract, Board has first right of refusal to accept buyer; 3) Put \$40,000 in house and rent it out.
- Doug spoke with Mayberry who was still interested in moving house, filling basement but NO concrete removal.

After discussion, Motion by Doug Hofer, 2nd by Slade Weller to recommend to council: Upon approval of variance by the city at Dec 4 meeting, that the Youth House be put up for sale (including the insurance roofing allowance) and to authorize the BOT to hire a realtor for the sale. Motion carried.

October Minutes: Motion by Marne Dooley/2nd Jeremy Mikkelsen to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Financial Report:

- October month ending balance: \$141,413
- October Weekly offering was up 23.98% from budgeted for the month/ YTD -6.67%
- Income VS Expense for October \$18,057.49/YTD \$64,616.56
- Expenses were down in October from budgeted
- Have received check for KalWal hail damage (Statement of loss is now \$306,707.98)
- Snow guards were installed and bill paid
- Outstanding bills- ABC Seamless pending/ phone system pending

Audit Committee: New Leader/new Team to be chosen. Completed December 1, 2024

Tudor Report:

- Net income for month \$844.00
- Unit 3 is still being repaired, 7 apartments rented
- Need to move insurance for property out of church budget and into Tudor budget. Yearly insurance is \$7026
- Received a complaint about parking lot misuse, it has been addressed.

Building Variance Application:

Variance meeting to be help December 4 at 5:15. Slade and Craig plan to attend

Insurance claims:

Church gutters completed

- Parsonage roof is scheduled to be repaired
- Ministry house- waiting on insurance adjuster to determine cost (Wayne will check with Matt B to see where this is at)
- Youth House- roof repair money to go with sale of the house.

<u>Gravel at Tudor</u>: pending to be done by Brady Beck

Insurance Coverage:

- 6 different providers are accredited in SD, all declined to bid
- Fischer Rounds were looking at a broker from out of state, but not accredited in SD
- State Farm bid:
 - 1. Tudor would need stand alone policy.
 - 2. Deductible would increase to \$15,000 up from \$2,500.
 - 3. Recommend reducing Youth House/Tudor coverage to actual value NOT replacement
 - 4. Premium is significantly increased (\$50,830)
 - 5. Can include workman's comp (\$3,460)
 - 6. Total package- \$54,295

Parsonage Rental:

• Breezeway door needs to be replaced

Ministry House:

- Current renter is leaving in December
- Will amend new lease to include language on no use of fireplace
- Rental rate \$900 + utilities

Snow Contract:

- · Still in search of snow removal options. Deferred to next meeting
- Neuharth's will do their own snow removal/lawn

<u>Fire Alarm:</u> Since repair, no problems. Motion by Slade Weller/2nd Jeremy Mikkelsen to approve payment of repair bill and signing of service contract for fire alarm maintenance with ABC Fire Alarm. Motion carried
