Dear members, friends, and family of Lutheran Memorial:

Deep Thoughts......."Discipline in the Spirit!" In Paul's second letter to Timothy, he writes, "For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and selfcontrol" (2nd Timothy 1:6-7). As our New Year has dawned, a new year always comes with a sense of new goals to be accomplished—new ways to navigate the same things—new calendars to fill—and of course, remembering to write a different number on anything and everything needing dates on them.

I was in the gym yesterday, on New Year's Day, and I wasn't truly surprised by how many people I saw, striving for a new chapter in their physical fitness. It's a great thing to achieve—an even greater thing if/when many of these colleagues in fitness find the drive and motivation to become "disciplined" into a routine of healthy living a routine of sustainability—a routine of saying 'Yes!', when we'd rather say "NO!" What this is...is 'discipline!' There is a reason the word 'discipleship' comes from the root of 'discipline'. When Jesus called his disciples—he didn't just call them to men on a journey to socialize with him amongst days of quietness if he had chosen to be alone, instead. What Jesus did, was called a dozen men into the "DISCIPLINE" of hearing God's Word—in the living flesh—mastering the laws of God in comparison to the Gospel that Jesus was teaching them to proclaim, and then ultimately disciplining them into trusting what they were about to see in His death and Resurrection! You see.....Jesus didn't need them to solely be witnesses to his Gospel—He needed them to become the most disciplined evangelists that this world had ever

seen, so that peoples of all nations would one day know the Gospel of Christ! As Paul discipled Timothy, along with many others, in the years of the disciples continuing in their work, Paul too, had to teach his followers the 'discipline' of the Spirit. He had to teach them the story—he had to proclaim the Good News with absolute clarity—he molded the theology and understanding of what all this means for generations to come—and what came after, is what we today call "The Church."

With this New Year, I invite all of you to join me in diving deeper into the discipline of the Spirit of our faith as well. Our faith is more than just attending worship when it works for us and our schedules. Our faith is more than simply stating that "I'm a Christian" because that's all I've known since I was child. Our faith is more than livestreams and clicks on social media in the name of Lutheran Memorial. Our faith is more than dropping our kids off at the doors. OUR FAITH, can be learned through discipline in reading scripture each day (We even gave you the tool to read the Bible in one year), our faith, can be studied in devout Bible study, which we offer weekly here at LMC. Our faith, can come through one-on-one conversations with your Pastor and other devout elders of the congregation who are very willing to share their stories of faithful journeys. As Paul said to Timothy centuries ago, "...fan into flame the gift of God...a Spirit not of fear, but of love and self-control." Do not be afraid this New Year—be confident in God's control—become more disciplined in His Word actually study it and know what it says—not just what we think it says, or what we want it to say. Dive deeper into your faith journey—trust Christ to lead you along the way! Blessings to all of you, brothers and sisters, in Christ!



Worship and Music

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord! Serve the Lord with gladness. Come into his presence with singing."
--Psalm 100 V 1-2

Imagine a worship service without music. I can't. I worship through music and song. God gave me the gift of music and singing, and it is my duty to worship Him with the gifts He has given to me. The job of Director of Worship and Music here at Lutheran Memorial Church is also a gift, and I am thankful everyday for the trust and faith that God and the people of this church have given me with this gift. Thank you to everyone who has been a part of music and worship these past four months. Lutheran Memorial Trustees Minutes | December 18, 2023

Members Present: Slade Weller, Lindsay Rounds, Doug Hofer, Marne Dooley, Danette Cronin, Jeri Wilcox

(Those absent - Wayne Winter, Jeremy Mikkelsen, Matt Brakke)

Others present: Pastor Craig Wexler, Beth Leidholt

Meeting called to order by Co-chairman Doug Hofer at 5:30 pm

Opening devotions by Pastor Craig.

Changes to agenda: Add steel roof and parsonage roof to Old Business

Minutes: Motion by Slade Weller/2nd Marne Dooley to approve November minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Financial Report:</u>

- November ending balance \$139,189
- Weekly offering down from budgeted by \$12,123; YTD down \$57,644
- Income VS Expenses for November -\$4,224
- Rentals income (parsonage + Ministry House) \$17,025
- Long Term Equipment account will receive \$14,975 from rental income (difference is deposits of \$2050)
- Proposed budget was reviewed. No action.
- Discussion included a suggestion to Council to communicate LMC's operating budget as related to **stewardship**, so the congregation is informed on budgeted needs of day-to-day operation.

Tudor Report:

- Net income for month \$356.46. YTD Net Income \$15,739.82
- All 8 units are currently rented

Building Variance Application:

- Building variance permit was approved by the city of Pierre. Permit is good for 1 year.
- Discussion: With variance approval, BOT is recommending sale of ministry house this summer and to rent the house for the next 6 months.

Insurance claims:

- Parsonage roof- repair pending (Dakota Storm). Need to get roof replacement under contract as soon as possible.
- Ministry house- adjuster noted minimal damage on roof, will follow up on repair. Need to find out what allowance Church Mutual will make on this repair.
- Steel roof on church- LMC has received \$155,000 for damages. There may be insurance consequences if we do not repair the roof. It was suggested that a 3rd party roof repair expert look at roof to determine need to replace. Slade will make contacts for this and request a written report.
- KalWal- Discussed the need to get this work under contract ASAP. Motion Slade Weller/2nd. Marne Dooley to
 approve and sign SpecPro contract now and not wait for further approval from Church Mutual. This will get
 LMC on the schedule for repair asap. Continue working with Church Mutual to bridge gap on cost/taxes. Motion
 carried.

Gravel at Tudor:

- Wayne Winter is working with Brady Beck to complete this work in very near future
- Need to get work scheduled and give 48-hour notice for Mills to alert renters that work will be done on parking lot.

Insurance Coverage:

- A SF company has offered a reasonable quote for coverage, but LMC must close out claims with Church Mutual before they will accept LMC as a client.
- Due to urgency and limited options, BOT recommends accepting the State Farm quote for LMC liability and
 property insurance and employee workman comp insurance. Once the work is all completed for hail damages
 from last summer's storm and our claim is closed out with Church Mututal, BOT will explore more affordable
 insurance coverage. Motion by Slade Weller/2nd. Marne Dooley to recommend acceptance of quote from
 State Farm for church property/workman comp insurance. Motion carried.

Snow Removal Contract:

 Discussion. Motion by Marne Dooley/2nd Slade Weller to contract with Dakota Sprinklers & Landscaping for snow removal in 2024. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Youth House Disposal Plans:

• Motion by Danette Cronin/2nd Slade Weller to hire Dawn Iverson to be realtor for sale of the Youth House property. Motion carried. Doug volunteered to be point of contact on this sale.

<u>Ministry House Rental</u>: Renters have been found. A 6-month lease will be written with no provision for renewal. Discussion of pets in LMC rental houses led to recommendation that future leases prohibit pets unless specifically allowed in advance in writing.

Lawn Care proposal:

- Motion by Marne Dooley/2nd Lindsay Rounds to enter into a contract for 2024 with Easland Lawn Service for mowing church property (minus Parsonage). Motion carried.
- Keep this item in old business as LMC continues to search for a long-term solution to lawn care.

Motion to adjourn Marne Dooley/ 2nd Lindsay Rounds. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:21 pm.
