Dear members, friends, and family of Lutheran Memorial:

Deep Thoughts......."Gratitude!" I've learned over the years that this word, gratitude, is quite different then 'thankfulness'. They often get used interchangeably, but they are different. Being thankful is a response. For example, I am overwhelmingly grateful for the generosity from many of you towards my family and I during "Pastor Appreciation Month" in October. Many of you expressed kind words and gestures in gifts, and they were all incredibly meaningful. This congregation has taken care of us over the years in many ways, and Carmen and I can never thank you enough—we don't have the words to express the care that many of you have shown, time-and-time again—but again, I say, "Thank You!"

But.....the word, "Gratitude", is one that I hadn't really used often in any context until my internship year, many years ago, in Stillwater, MN. I remember Pastor Linda, the Associate Pastor, there at Our Saviors, would often say the phrase, "Let's have an attitude of gratitude!" She was always the optimist in the room on most everything. She had an aura of positivity, even though she had gone through many trials and tribulations in her life, as she had shared with me over the year that we worked closely together. Over the years, I have come to realize that "Gratitude" is less of a feeling of response, but rather, it is a 'disposition' we choose to have throughout our moments in life. We can all! either have the disposition of never having enough—we can have the disposition of feeling defeated—we can have the disposition of whining or complaining—we can have a disposition of jealousy----the list goes on. However, an 'attitude of gratitude'—being grateful—choosing to be grateful, is actually a disposition of trusting God, and when

we trust God, it is also an expression of faith. Martin Luther reminds us in his small catechism that when we say the words, "Give us this day our daily bread", in the Lord's Prayer, that we are not just asking for 'stuff', rather, we are repeating the words that Jesus himself instructed his disciples when they asked him how to pray. So, if Jesus is telling us to ask God the Father for our daily bread, and he promises that the Father hears the words and makes the provisions, when we too say the words, then we ought to trust that God gives and will continue to give us what we need. As faithful disciples ourselves, we can express our trust in God with an "ATTITUDE OF GRATITUDE!"

I understand this can be easier said than done these days, with inflation at its highest for many of us, and it only seems to continue to rise. But while financial times are more difficult than even just a couple years ago—as we have to negotiate, and re-negotiate our budgets and priorities—as we tighten the belts and depressingly look at the few grocery bags in our hands and wonder how so little, cost so much, I still encourage each of us to remind ourselves how blessed we truly are in comparison to most throughout the world. It starts with a shift in our attitude a shift in our disposition. And trust me—I am writing these words to myself on a daily basis as well! "An attitude of gratitude!" as Pastor Linda's words echo in my memory. God never shirks on his promises to give us exactly what we need each day. Let us trust in His promise—let us have gratitude in His promise—and let us give thanks in response to what He has given, especially as the holiday of Thanksgiving itself, approaches closer by the day. 

## Lutheran Memorial Council Minutes | October 17, 2023

Senior Pastor Craig Wexler Marcie Long, President Doug Hofer, Trustees Kim Farries, Member at-large Bryan Walz, Past President Dan Swartos, Vice President Kelly Nelson, Treasurer Jay Vogt, Member at-large

Absent: Todd Bernhard, Andrea Clarke

Meeting Called to Order by President Long at 7:04 p.m. Prayer was led by Pastor Craig.

Motion made by Dan Swartos to approve the consent agenda. Second by Brian Walz. Discussion was presented by Kelly Nelson by way of an update on the financials of the Church. LMC is at 75% of the budget for the year, and in general, expenses are down. There are three items that will be a significant impact on the budget for the remainder of the year: 1) the addition of Rodd Bauck's salary, 2) the expectation of an increase in the MDU invoices, and 3) the expense of new property insurance as our current insurance policy will be cancelled December 31, 2023.

Motion to approve consent agenda carried unanimously.

Motion to approve minutes electronically on 10-24-23 made by Marcie Long, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kelly Nelson; motion carried.

#### **Discussion Items**

- Trustees -- Doug Hofer
  - The building permit parking variance is being managed by Slade Weller. He is still working diligently on the process and is optimistic that the city of Pierre will return a positive result. There is a lot of information being supplied for the application.
  - The property insurance claim settlement has been received in the amount of roughly \$309,000. There is a holdback amount of about \$22,000 that we should be able to recover. There is a 1-year time limit to recover any hold back amount. A separate account has been established to keep all the insurance proceeds accounted for by the Church.
  - Our property insurance has been cancelled by the carrier effective December 31, 2023. Trustees are
    getting quotes from Fischer Rounds agent, Mike Hoffmeister. There is a lot of information being asked
    for and supplied to facilitate a successful negotiation. Expect a new policy premium to be at least double
    the existing policy, and the deductible will also probably increase based on a percentage of the value of
    the property and liability.
  - Trustees will get facts to the Council on the Youth House next month.
  - Dave and Lisa Neuharth are now renting the parsonage. They will now pay for all utilities, removing the Church from any of the billings. Some repairs need to be made and there is yard work that needs to be done next spring.
- Youth Team -- Marcie Long
  - o Off to a busy start with the new year. Fall Festival is next week (Sunday). Fundraisers are being organized and the Youth Group is growing!
  - The Banquet was served last week (only 187 meals). The weather made attendance quite low and there were many left-overs hope to use at the Church.
  - o Children, Youth and Family will have a Christmas tree at the Capital this year.

- Pastor Craig's Report
  - Church life is busy with many baptisms, weddings, and funerals. Sunday service is growing, Wednesday service is full, and Saturday service is steady.
  - Staff evaluations have gone out. Pastor Craig will evaluate in November.
  - The Church trip to Israel has been cancelled due to the conflict that has developed in Israel/Palestine.
  - A Project Manager is <u>needed</u> for the building project. Phase I and Phase II are done. We have entered
     Phase III. Need strong leadership to see our vision fulfilled.
  - Synod update from Bishops Eaton and Constanza emphasized preparation for the future to shape our theology. All Region 3 rostered leaders were invited to a recorded webinar on Oct. 17<sup>th</sup> and there was some disappointment that no conversation was truly held.

#### **Old Business**

- Youth House see Trustee's report.
- The Nominating Committee met the week of Oct. 9<sup>th</sup> and will meet again on Nov. 13<sup>th</sup>. Progress is being made, and there are many great names proposed for the upcoming vacancies. Those vacancies are one Trustee and one Council member.
- Building Permit see Trustee's report.

#### **New Business**

- Revised Constitution Discussion about increasing the number of at-large Council members from three to five.
  Probably OK for just a Council change, but we need to be careful about amending the Constitution. There may
  be repercussions that would force change to other parts of the Constitution, which could be problematic. Remember: need 60-day notice to the congregation for a constitutional amendment. Also, need to have notice
  for the Resolution of the Statement of Faith.
- Insurance Policy see Trustee's report.
- 2024 Budget Kelly Nelson and Beth Leidholt are going to be starting the work for the new year's budget. If a balanced budget is not a reality, the Council will support and stand behind an actual real budget that Kelly and Beth develop.
- 2024 Staff Compensation Package The 2023 comp package was a 5% raise, 3% bonus, and a retirement contribution was started for staff. We need to start thinking about what the compensation should be next year. There needs to be good discussion at the November meeting to establish the compensation package. Approval needs to be given at the December meeting.

#### Other Business - none

Motion to adjourn the meeting made by Kelly Nelson, second by Kim Farries; motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 8:09 p.m.

#### **Financial Report:**

- September month ending balance: \$123,356
- September Weekly offering down 8.26% from budgeted/YTD down 8.68% from budgeted
- Income VS Expense for September \$21,778.21/YTD \$46,599.07
- Arkansas funds \$21,785.81 significantly helped this cash flow
- Expenses were down in September
- Beth requested to wait until December before transferring money to the Long-Term Maintenance Fund

#### **Tudor Report:**

- 7 apartments rented; 1 apartment is still being repaired
- Mills will be paying property taxes this month

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### **Building Variance Application:**

• Slade made initial contact with city, making plan to submit application for the variance to the city at their next meeting.

#### Insurance claims:

- Kalwall- Insurance will pay the estimated repair costs. Check pending.
- Gutters- ABC bid to replace \$972 (insurance \$549) It is proposed to talk with Church Mutual about new bid and request approval. Will talk to John Kist about inspecting sewer vents and Matt Northrup about installing snow guards before gutters are repaired.
- Roofs Ministry House- no adjustment (**Matt will ask Dakota Storm to reassess roof,** LMC will submit to insurance if damaged
  - Parsonage- bid \$16,265 proceed for sure; \$11,854 replacement cost
  - Youth House- bid house \$8,000/garage \$4,100

#### **Gravel (Tudor):**

• B. Beck has LMC schedule to be done before snow.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### **Insurance Carrier:**

- Church Mutual Insurance has notified LMC of cancellation of all policies effective 12-31-23
- Seeking property insurance bids from Fischer Rounds
- Doug compiled an LMC properties information sheet for reference
- Discussion was held on the realities of insurance in the Midwest and in today's economy
- No action

#### Fire Alarm Monitoring System Contract Proposal for the elevator:

- Frequently receiving false alarm alerts- Slade will call ABC and elevator company, Kone Care, to reach a resolution to the problem
- · Deferred until more information is obtained

#### Parsonage Rental:

- Previous renter moved out Oct 3; Doug inspected Oct 3. Numerous concerns were noted
- Motion by Marne Dooley/2nd Matt Brakke to retain the full deposit from previous renter to make repairs and pay for cleaning.
- Need to repair holes in the yard/reseed yard/ replace screen door
- Back door landing not addressed
- All Renters are responsible for utilities (LMC is billed and pays for utility expenses at rentals, LMC then bills each renter for reimbursement of those expenses.)

#### **Snow Contract:**

• Mills is now responsible for snow removal at the Tudor building. Wayne will discuss with Mills on who they use.

#### Youth House:

- As Trustees were charged by the council to handle the disposition of Youth House, discussion was held at length on what to do with this property
- It was agreed that FACTS and ESTIMATES are needed to make an informed decision
  - -consult a realtor to determine realistic value of the house and is it sellable? (Lindsay will make a realtor contact)
  - -cost to remove structure? Any interest? (**Doug will contact Steph Judson to gather names of possible interested parties from previous inquiries**) May contact Mayberry to determine removal costs. **Slade will check with Becks on cost to remove house**.
  - What costs remain once the lot is vacant?
- Defer to next meeting after information is gathered.

#### Warren's report

- Attempting to locate keys for parsonage for the new renters. May need to change locks.
- Chase will be patching the crack in the fiberglass cowling of the church roof- \$600
